Award Ceremony of the 2016 Young Europeans Award: "How far does Europe reach?"

Pupils aged 14 to 16 coming from four different schools in Germany, France, Poland and Ukraine convinced the jury of the Young Europeans Award (YEA), under the presidency of **Volker Schlön-dorff**, with their common project **"The colourful face of Europe".** The prize is a trip to the European institutions.

In their project the contest winners set the focus on the situation of migrants in the past and the present, starting by migration experiences in their own families and reflecting on the notion of "home".

The official Award Ceremony takes place on Tuesday, September 20, 2016, from 12:15 pm to 3:00 pm at the House of Regions (Rue Montoyer 21, 1000 Brussels).
